# 2. DECISION-MAKERS AND GOVERNMENT AUTHORITIES (INFORMATION GENERATORS)

#### A. Instructional Focus

This model curriculum targets decision -makers and members of national government organizations that will regularly use information in the BCH and generate information to be made available to it, including staff of Competent National Authorities; members of the national BCH Task Force and risk assessors.

- CSFI06: A company representative seeks information on procedures for exporting Living Modified Organisms (LMOs).
- CSFI07: A National Development Agency seeks information on existing Capacity-Building programs.
- CSFI08: A member of the public looks for information about a genetically modified food product.
- CSFI10: A regulator in Japan has received a request to import potatoes from the Republic of Korea.
- CSFI11: A risk assessor wants to find information relevant to assessing virus-resistant papaya.
- CSI01: A medical researcher seeks information about applying the Advance Informed Agreement procedure.
- CSI02: A Competent National Authority (CNA) provides information about a decision to the BCH.
- CSI04: A country has just become a Party to the Cartagena Protocol and must fulfill its information-sharing obligations.
