



CASE STUDY (CSFI02):

A regulator wants to determine what genetically modified crops intended for food feed or processing may enter their territory.

Objective:

Use the Biosafety Clearing House (BCH) to determine what Genetically Modified (GM) crops have been approved by trading partner countries.

Scenario:

You are responsible for organizing risk assessments in St Lucia. Your government has recently ratified the Protocol but has not yet approved the release of any Living Modified Organisms (LMOs). You have been tasked to determine the unique identifiers (IDs) of any GM crops that may enter your territory via imports from your trading partners to determine if you need to conduct additional risk assessments.

You are currently importing wheat, barley, and rice from several countries in the Latin American region, the US, and Canada. Many goods are traded with other islands in the Caribbean region.
